Egypt Healthcare Overview

In July 2018, the World Bank announced plans to invest EGP9.5bn (USD530mn) towards Egypt's healthcare system as part of the country's health reform package. The investment will be staggered over the coming five years to 2022 and will be implemented via the Egyptian Ministry of Health and Population (MoHP)

Key aims of the five-year project 'Transforming Egypt's Healthcare System' include:

- ✓ Scaling up Egypt's Hepatitis C program to treat 1.5mn patients per annum.
- ✓ Screening 20mn adults against non-communicable diseases and risk factors.
- ✓ Introducing a new universal health insurance system.
- ✓ Improving the quality of care across 600 primary healthcare facilities and 27 hospitals, with new digital tools being introduced.

Ongoing Healthcare Infrastructure Projects Will Support Medical Device Market Growth

- September 2018: The president inaugurate of health projects including a military hospital in Menoufiya governorate, a national specialized medical institute in Damanhour, and a memorial institute for ophthalmology research in Giza.
- August 2018: Saudi investor Fawaz Mohammed Bashraheel, disclosed a plan to open an integrated medical city project in Egypt, with an initial investment of USD1bn. The project will be built on an area of 500,000 square metres and will be the biggest medical city in the world.
- April 2018: Al Motahedoon Group for Real Estate Development and Management launched a new project, Eterna Helathcare City, a high-class medical complex located at the centre of Mivida's business district. The project will be developed at a total cost of EGP1.2bn (USD68.0mn) and will be delivered by 2021. This is the third medical real estate development by Al Motahedoon Group, following Healthcare City (HCC) and the Cairo Medical Centre (CMC).
- February 2018: Health Minister Ahmed Emad Eddin announced the establishment of an integrated medical city in the new administrative capital. The medical city will include three hospitals; a 300-bed general hospital with all medical specialties, a 300-bed children's hospital and a 300-bed hospital for women and maternity care. The new capital will be located between Cairo and the Suez Canal region and will accommodate up to five million people.

- ✓ Over the next decade construction of 172 public hospitals, 377 private clinics, 45 specialized heath units and 70 centres focusing on people with disabilities will increase demand for medical equipment and supplies, as well as medical construction services.
- ✓ Algerians are increasingly turning to private clinics for outpatient care.
- Opportunities will increase for the design and management of such facilities and for sales of cutting-edge diagnostics and treatment equipment.
- ✓ Cosmetic surgery is not yet common, but consumer interest is rising.
